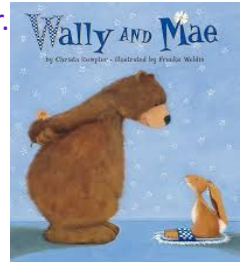


St. Blaise

February is Black History Month. Let's celebrate by learning more about a few of our Black Catholic Saints.

Did you know there are over 900 Black Catholic Saints?

St. Maurice

He is Saint Maurice of Agaunum, born less than 250 years after Jesus Christ. He became a general in the Roman army, stationed in what is now France. Saint Maurice and his six thousand African soldiers were ordered to put down a rebellion against the empire. When Saint Maurice discovered they all were Christians, he and his men refused to fight their fellow Christians. They also refused to sacrifice to the Roman gods. For this, the emperor had Saint Maurice and nearly all of his Theban Legion executed. A basilica in Agaunum, Switzerland enshrines their relic remains today.



St. Josephine Bakhita

When just a little girl, Saint Josephine Bakhita (Bah-KEE-tah), was kidnapped from her loving family in the Sudan, and sold into brutal slavery. Her different "owners" frequently beat and tortured her. Finally when she was sold to an Italian diplomat, at age 14, St. Josephine Bakhita received Christian instruction for the first time from the Sisters of Charity in Venice, Italy. Later, when the diplomat's family returned to Africa, Saint Josephine Bakhita refused to go with them. She remained within the protection of the Sisters' convent in Italy, where slavery was illegal. For the next 50 years, she joyfully and faithfully served as the convent's cook, seamstress, sacristan, and doorkeeper until her death in 1947.

St. Monica

Saint Monica was a woman of great faith. Through her patience, gentleness, and prayers, she converted her pagan husband, with whom her parents had given her in marriage. Today, we know her as the patron saint of alcoholics, conversion, mothers, and wives.



St. Martin de Porres

His father was a Spanish nobleman, his mother a black former slave. De Porres worked on behalf of the poor throughout his life. He was canonized in 1962 during the height of the Civil Rights Movement.

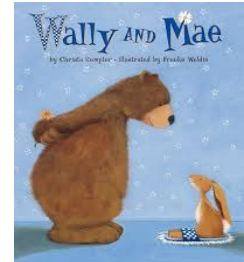

Febrero es el Mes de la Historia Negra. Celebrémoslo conociendo mejor a algunos de nuestros santos católicos negros.

¿Sabías que hay más de 900 santos católicos negros?



St. Maurice

Se trata de San Mauricio de Aganaum, nacido menos de 250 años después de Jesucristo. Llegó a ser general del ejército romano, destinado en la actual Francia. San Mauricio y sus seis mil soldados africanos recibieron la orden de sofocar una rebelión contra el imperio. Cuando San Mauricio descubrió que todos eran cristianos, él y sus hombres se negaron a luchar contra sus compatriotas. También se negaron a sacrificar a los dioses romanos. Por ello, el emperador mandó ejecutar a San Mauricio y a casi toda su legión tebana. Una basílica en Aganaum (Suiza) alberga hoy sus reliquias.



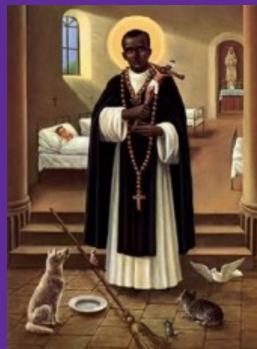
St. Monica

Santa Mónica fue una mujer de gran fe. Gracias a su paciencia, dulzura y oraciones, convirtió a su marido pagano, con el que sus padres la habían dado en matrimonio. Hoy la conocemos como patrona de los alcohólicos, de la conversión, de las madres y de las esposas.



St. Josephine Bakhita

Cuando era sólo una niña, Santa Josefina Bakhita fue secuestrada de su familia en Sudán y vendida como esclava. Sus diferentes «dueños» la golpeaban y torturaban con frecuencia. Finalmente, cuando fue vendida a un diplomático italiano, a la edad de 14 años, Santa Josefina Bakhita recibió instrucción cristiana por primera vez de las Hermanas de la Caridad en Venecia, Italia. Más tarde, cuando la familia del diplomático regresó a África, Santa Josefina Bakhita se negó a ir con ellos. Permaneció bajo la protección del convento de las Hermanas en Italia, donde la esclavitud era ilegal. Durante los 50 años siguientes, sirvió con alegría y fidelidad como cocinera, costurera, sacristana y portera del convento, hasta su muerte en 1947.



St. Martin de Porres

Su padre era un noble español, su madre una antigua esclava negra. De Porres trabajó en favor de los pobres durante toda su vida. Fue canonizado en 1962, en pleno auge del Movimiento por los Derechos Civiles.
